2013 was yet another year of record growth for our YMCA. We reached out and supported more than 108,000 people through a growing collection of programs, sites and facilities in 178 locations.



64% of these people were kids.

This is critical as trends show that this is the first generation of children in modern history to inherit a lower life expectancy than their parents. Healthy kids are the foundation and future for building healthy communities. In 2013, we helped 69,444 kids grow healthier, stronger and more confident, supporting them in realizing their potential through meaningful engagement with their family, friends and peers.

But we don't stop with kids. Our Y recognizes that healthy kids can't exist without healthy adult role models and active and engaged communities. Our portfolio of programs address complex issues and help people to realize the best in themselves. 2013 Significant Achievements

Significant progress was made on increasing our YMCA's impact and reach. Four interdependent strategic directions frame the year's highlights:

Growth – Extending our reach

- Centres of Community: Advanced our Capital Growth and Enhancement Strategy, focusing on discussions with municipalities about three new potential YMCA Centres of Community in Coquitlam, Surrey and South Vancouver.
- Neighbourhood Hubs: Continued development of three new YMCA child care centres with partners at Children's and Women's Hospital, Surrey City Hall and Woodwards, which opened in July 2013.
- Meeting Community Needs: Developed a partnership with the City of Burnaby, Burnaby Community Services, Burnaby Meals on Wheels and MOSAIC to open the Brentwood Community Resource Centre in 2014. When open, the centre will provide a range of interconnected programs and services to support one of the fastest growing and most diverse communities in the Lower Mainland. Thank you to our key donor Stantec for making this possible.

Impact – Helping people and organizations achieve their potential

- Bringing People Together: Research aligned with the Vancouver Foundation study demonstrates that people who have been with the Y for longer periods of time have a higher likelihood of being connected and engaged with their community.
- Improving Access: One in five children coming to the YMCA requires financial assistance and the demand for support continues to grow each year. Thanks to the generosity of our donors and volunteers, we removed the financial barrier for 10,980 people so that they could access important Y programs to help them lead healthy, active and engaged lives.

Value – Helping people recognize and invest in our work

- Building Philanthropic Culture: Hosted the 2013 NAYDO Conference (North American YMCA Development Organization), bringing together 1,100 delegates from around the world to advance the philanthropic mission of the YMCA.
- Increasing Awareness: Focused on highlighting the Y as a charity through two projects:

 developing the first national awareness campaign called YMCA Potential and 2) profiling two employees and the important work they do as part of an Undercover Boss episode featuring the YMCA across Canada.
- Transformational Gift: Received a generous gift to develop a Welcome, Learning and Leadership Centre at YMCA Camp Elphinstone.

Excellence – Delivering our promise and enhancing our capacity

- **Operations:** Continued to experience record growth, serving 11,566 more people at 28 new program locations. Much of this growth can be attributed to our team's focus on being relevant to children, young adults and families across key YMCA offerings such as Health, Fitness & Aquatics, Camps, Child Care, Youth Leadership Development and Employment.
- Human Resources: Introduced new systems to support strategic growth and ensure consistency across a growing team— Human Resources Information System, Google platform and national child protection standards. Invested in the development of people through the YMCA LEAD Initiative, a leadership-training program for staff, and a renewed governance structure to deepen the engagement of policy volunteers.


